
Spring is upon us! The robins have started to reappear, the days are getting longer, and I'm starting to see small buds appear on my flowering bushes. With the change of the seasons this year also comes a season of changes for us at Spokane Valley UMC – staff changes, that is! We've had quite a few shifts take place as of late, so I'd like to use my newsletter article this month to bring everyone up to speed! I'd also like to say up front a huge **THANK YOU** to our Staff/Parish Relations Team and our SPRC Chair, Joyce Johnson! They have had their work cut out for them and there's more to do but they continue to faithfully share their gifts of leadership, discernment, and wisdom (not to mention time!) as we've navigated a somewhat unexpected and priority workload. In each paragraph below, I will offer a summary of where we are in the process of filling each staff position but if you have any lingering questions or comments, please reach out to me or Joyce Johnson. Let's jump in!

Henderson announced that the time had come for him to faithfully conclude his ministry as our **Director of Music**. We expressed our gratitude to him and blessed him forth during the Mardi Grasthemed *Singing Sunday Celebration Service* on March 2. The following day, Betsy Pletscher, our staff accompanist, graciously stepped in to serve as our interim Director of Music and has been capably leading our Traditional Choir, working collaboratively with me to choose the hymns for our Lenten season of worship, and preparing to play all the music for each service. She assured us back in February when we discussed this shift in her responsibilities that she could serve through the Spring which gave us some much needed breathing room to conduct the search for a new Director of Music. At this point, our SPRC has begun identifying the people who will serve on the search committee for this staff position, and we are assembling a team with a mix of SPRC members, choir members, and staff who will ultimately work closely with the person selected. We anticipate that the team will begin to meet in early April to review and update the current job description, set a salary scale, and begin advertising for the position. It may be ambitious, but we hope to begin interviewing mid-May and have someone in place this summer!

Next up is the **Coordinator of Ministries with Children** position! As many of you know, Samantha (Wallace) Anglin served in that role starting in June 2022 and while working with us, she spent much of those years working toward a *Master of Science in Mental Health & Wellness* with an emphasis in *Family Dynamics*. She graduated in May of 2024 and, following a busy summer preparing for her and Easton's wedding in October, began the search for a job in her career field. I was filled with pride when Sam shared with me at the end of January the exciting news that she had been hired by Frontier Behavior Health as a full-time intake clinician! But I also knew that with this news came the reality that her time of service as our Coordinator of Ministries with Children had to come to an end. We celebrated her ministry among us in worship on March 9 and blessed her forth as she embarks on this new way of serving God's people!

SPRC acknowledged that we needed to move quickly to fill this position and that our growing Sunday School and Youth program required a new system of organization to accommodate this amazing growth so the second week of March, Joyce Johnson and I met with Jackie Florian, who had been teaching Sunday School the past year and leading Youth Group since last Fall, to learn more about the needs of the two age groups and what her dreams were for the children and youth of our church. What came of that conversation was two-fold: (1) The SPRC redesigned the position and renamed it **Coordinator of Ministries with Young People** to reflect that it would encompass coordinated oversight for the Nursery, Sunday School classes, Youth Group, and perhaps, in time, a ministry for young adult and college-aged people. This new position has MANY responsibilities, so we added a new one that directs the staff member to work with me and our congregation to create a Ministry Team for Ministries with Young People to support this ministry area. (2) The SPRC offered the position to Jackie Florian, and she enthusiastically accepted! Jackie is close to completing a Master of Social Work from EWU and is able to commit 20-25 hours per week to this role with the longer weeks including our bi-weekly Youth Group gathering. Her official start date was March 25 and we began

worship on March 23 with the kids and youth present that day joining me in a prayer and a laying on of hands to bless her into this new ministry adventure!

We've had several new families with both elementary and middle school aged kids start attending church so much so that the time has come for us to add a second Sunday School class! While Miss Jackie (as the kids call her) will continue to teach the Elementary-aged class on Sunday mornings, we are seeking someone to teach a class for Middle Schoolers (6th-8th grade). Given their age range and spiritual development phase, it is our (SPRC, Jackie, and my) determination that this class should offer Confirmation curriculum on a three-year rotational basis to help prepare these disciples for confirmation on Pentecost in their 8th grade year. As of the last week of March, we've begun putting together a search team for this position with representatives from SPRC, Miss Jackie, and a member of our congregation who has a child in this age range. As with the Director of Music search team, this team will revise and update the Sunday School Teacher Job Description to reflect the unique needs of our middle school-aged kids and then begin the search! Our hope would be to have someone in the role within the next two months. If you or someone you know has a gift for teaching and would find fulfillment in teaching Confirmation curriculum to a bunch of lovely junior high kids, please let me or Joyce Johnson know!

Last, but certainly not least is our **Nursery Caregiver** position. Due to unexpected family circumstances, Cassandra Stickland, who has served as our Nursery Caregiver since September of 2022, resigned effective March 18. We had hoped to be able to express our gratitude to her in worship, but the situation made it difficult for her to come on a Sunday, so the SPRC sent her a card and a gift on behalf of the congregation to thank her for her ministry among us. She provided excellent care to our youngest disciples and was grateful for the opportunity to serve with us. As with the previous two open positions, the SPRC is in the process of putting together a search team to revise and update the job description, post the open position, and begin interviewing candidates. This is a vital ministry for our growing church family, so we hope to fill the position as soon as possible. If you or someone you know is available for two hours on Sunday mornings and loves ministering to infants and young children, please contact me or Joyce Johnson.

Whew! That's a lot of change! I am deeply grateful to Joyce Johnson for her leadership and guidance of our Staff/Parish Relations Committee and oh so thankful to our team for all they have done and continue to do to fill these open positions. Please join me in thanking our team and praying for our process. God is doing a new thing among us and that is worthy of our praise! Twinlow Camp Opportunity to Serve

First UMC of Wenatchee is working on a mission/work trip to Twinlow Camp in Rathdrum Idaho (just outside of Couer d'Alene).

We have space for additional volunteers and want to extend the invitation to Spokane Valley UMC. If you are interested in helping out, we would love to have you!

Twinlow has several projects that need attention before the summer camp season and we thought this would be a great way for us to serve in the conference, connect with one another, and grow in our own discipleship.

We plan to go Sunday, May 4th (after church) and have dinner, worship and a time of team building. Then we'll get to work on Monday morning. We'll work each day and finish Thursday (possibly driving back that day, and possibly staying one more day and returning Friday).

Twinlow has Selkirk Lodge with dorm style rooms (queen bed with 1 twin bunk bed) with en suite bathrooms. There are also RV spaces if someone wants to bring a rig.

It is close enough that if someone wanted to come and just work 1 or 2 days of the trip, we can accommodate that, or you can just come for the day, eat lunch, and stay at your home.

We will try and have skilled team leaders who can run point for individual jobs. But you do not need to be skilled to join (inherent to mission trips is that we train folks on the job).
