Marshallese Congregation Worshipping in the Chapel

If you're not familiar with the Marshall Islands, they are a chain of volcanic islands and coral atolls located between Hawaii and the Philippines in the central Pacific Ocean. Spokane and Spokane Valley are home to more than 5000 Marshallese who speak their native language by the same name. A few months ago we were contacted by a pastor who serves a Marshallese congregation here in Spokane Valley. He was seeking a place for his congregation to worship God and share Christian fellowship. They came and toured our facility and immediately fell in love with our historic 1939 Chapel. The congregation comprises around 35 adults, youth, and children and they will be using our Chapel for worship on Sunday afternoons at 3pm. We are very excited to welcome them and plan to explore opportunities for cultural exchange and faith sharing in the future!

Season of Change for NAOMI Community

For many years our church has supported the NAOMI Community, a local non-profit that offers women and children who have experienced trauma a safe space to be seen, supported, and restored through Christ-centered care. Starting last November, we opened our church to host their community meal and we delighted in the opportunity to expand our partnership. However, they are currently in a season of transition, prayerfully discerning what the future holds following a decision to align their hiring practices more closely with their Christ-centered care, which included all staff affirming Christian values. As a result, several key staff members chose to step away from their roles. At this time, they are not offering services and are not accepting donations. I invite you to hold their leadership, staff, and most especially, the women and children who were served by them, in your prayers. Due to this change, we are unable to donate the paper products we collected for them in May. These will be redirected to both the Basic Needs Program at SFCC that Zack Reiber operates and the Mission Community Outreach Center directed by Ali Norris. Thank you for your understanding.

Update on Staff Searches

If you were in worship on Sunday, May 18, then you know we celebrated that Betsy Pletscher has been named our Director of Music! After many years as our Staff Accompanist and several months as interim Director of Music, our SPRC Search Team and the Traditional Choir all unanimously agreed she was who the Spirit was calling to serve among us in this role! We will now shift to searching for a new Staff Accompanist!

We also welcomed Christopher Nilles to the staff as our new Nursery Caregiver! He and his wife, Heather, along with their two lovely children, Alex (X-Man) and Aurora, joined our church last summer and he has been serving as substitute during our search process. He found great joy in the work and ultimately chose to apply!

We are still "in process" with our second Sunday School teacher but have finalized the format for that position and our bi-weekly Confirmation class. Starting July 6, Middle and High Schoolers will both have the opportunity to participate in the class *and* attend Youth Group on a bi-weekly rotating basis. We feel this schedule gives us the opportunity to provide faith formation and Christian fellowship for this age group each week after worship!

This year United Methodist laity and clergy will gather at Bothell UMC (Bothell, WA) June 26-28th for our annual time of holy conferencing. Due to his work and school schedule, Zack Reiber, our lay leader, is unable to attend. In his place, our Church Council has elected Margie Manfred, our Director of Hospitality. 

Increased Need for Rent Assistance

Each year, it is our tradition at Spokane Valley UMC to take a special Christmas offering to help extend the peace, hope, love and joy of God to people experiencing hardship in our community. 100% of what is given is placed in my Pastor's Discretionary Fund and I use it when someone calls the church or comes by in need of help with a utility bill, a rent payment, a tank of gas, or food. We have recently seen a marked uptick in the number of people in need of rental assistance to avoid penalties or possible eviction. As such, this fund has been drawn down to less than \$1000 as of May 15. Our Financial Resources Support Team met and discussed the increased need for rent assistance and affirmed prioritizing housing needs over other forms of assistance until the fund is replenished. I offer this as information for all and also as an invitation to those who may want to contribute to this fund to help people in need.




June 1 is Volunteer Day! Wear your T-shirts, sweaters, or whatever represents the organization(s) where you volunteer.


United Women in Faith
